

BRIEF HISTORY OF PATENTS

- England, 1449
- King Henry VI wanted stained glass for Eton College and King's College, Cambridge
- Sent John of Utynam a patent (letter)
- Granted a 20-year monopoly to produce and teach
- Statute of Monopolies, 1624
- Only the wealthy got patents
- Prior to independence, the king of England officially owned all American IP


James Watt's Steam Engine (1769)



U.S. PATENT LAW

- Article I, Section 8, Clause 8 of the United States Constitution
 "The Congress shall have Power . . . To Promote the Progress of Science and useful Arts, by securing for limited Times to Authors and Inventors the exclusive Right to their respective Writings and Discoveries."
- First Patent Act of 1790 (before the Bill of Rights)
- Anyone could get a patent no requirement to build it
- Patent markets for selling, licensing, and trading patent rights


PATENT RIGHTS AND GOP

- Utility patent
 - Apparatus
 - Method
- Design patent

WHAT DOES A PATENT PROTECT?

- Exclusive use rights for a limited period of time
- A method:
 - Technical process (e.g., chemical process or software)
 - Business process (very hard since the Supreme Court's Alice case)
- An apparatus:
 - Physical components, how they interconnect
 - Mechanical
 - Électrical
 - Software



WHAT IS A PROVISIONAL PATENT?

- A one year placeholder
- Cheaper than a nonprovisional patent
- Needs to cover all aspects of the invention
- Be careful not to reveal trade secrets
- Must be enabling
- By itself, provides no rights



- File at least one patent
- File it early (not a provisional)
- Use a patent attorney
- Defensive reasons
- Lasting value
- Offensive reasons




